

# **Life Connections**

Metacognitive skill targeted: Reflection, knowledge transfer, self-regulation

Age group: 10-14 years

**Duration:** 20 minutes

#### Materials needed:

- Worksheet or notebook for reflection
- Pens or pencils
- A quiet moment for class discussion or writing
- [] (Optional) Reflection prompt on the board or projector:

"How can you use today's learning in your everyday life?"

# **Activity Description**

At the end of the lesson, students are asked to reflect on how the day's learning connects to real life.

By thinking about where and how they can apply what they've learned, students make meaningful links between classroom content and everyday experiences.

# **Example** - The Sirens and Real Life

**Lesson Topic:** The Sirens in *The Odyssey* 

**Life Connection Question:** How can you apply this story in real life?

#### **Example Answer:**

"Like Odysseus, we sometimes face temptations that distract us from our goals. I can learn to stay focused, even when something seems exciting but could lead me off track."





#### **Instructions**

- S Listen carefully to the story or lesson (e.g. The Sirens in *The Odyssey*).
- A Think about the main idea or lesson behind the story.
- Ask yourself: "When does something like this happen in real life?"
- Mrite 1–2 sentences about how you can use this idea in your everyday life.
- Share your answer with a classmate or the whole class if asked.
- Reflect: What did you learn about yourself or your choices through this connection?

### **Useful Tips \***

- **S** Use "I" statements to make it personal (e.g. "I can relate because...")
- Keep your answer short but meaningful 1–2 sentences is enough
- There's no right or wrong answer your connection is unique to you!
